

**AT THEIR BREAKING POINT:
Homeowners take to the streets – and to
the homes of some of the most prominent
CEOs – to protest.
BYOTP: Bring Your Own Torch and Pitchfork**



In recent weeks, homeowners facing foreclosure have taken a page out of Mary Shelley's *Frankenstein* and in the process, put the fear of God in CEO's from banks and mortgage lenders across America.

Angry homeowners, facing foreclosure because of predatory lending practices, have organized and are swarming the private estates of executives and dumping tattered old sofas and other "junk" in their yards in protest.

In Greenwich, CT, the local police seemed to sympathize with the protestors.

Many of the cops called to the scene experienced foreclosure, either directly or indirectly through a family member and were sympathetic to the protestors. No arrests were made.

Few media outlets have reported the uprisings. Some have told POA media coverage may spawn more frequent and violent protests and may take root in other industries loathed by the consumer, like insurance.

The group, [Neighborhood Assistance Corporation of America](#) (NACA), has organized protests across the country and refers to them as the "Predator's Tour."

Participants in the "tours" sport bright yellow shirts that read, "Stop Loan Sharks". NACA says their protestors demand more accountability from the CEOs of the financial institutions responsible for the millions of unaffordable mortgages.

According to NACA's web site, "We can't let them live quietly in a lap of luxury while they throw hard working Americans out on the street."

Much to the embarrassment of the CEOs, protestors are fully within their legal rights to protest peacefully.
